and has declared his plots and schemes to be clear and exposed. This openness can be examined from several aspects—but before we explore that, it is necessary to better understand the meaning of Satan's enmity.

When we consider Satan our enemy, we are referring to a threat that actively works to our detriment—one that employs every possible means to prevent us from

attaining our eternal purpose and reaching bliss. He utilizes all available tools to obstruct our healthy birth into the Hereafter and to prevent us from attaining resemblance to Allah. In other words, he positions himself directly upon the straight path, standing as an obstacle between us and our journey toward Allah. Moreover, since Satan regards us as the reason for his expulsion from Heaven and the loss of his former station, he is driven by immense motivation to oppose us. He harbors no fear or hesitation in declaring clear enmity against us.

Satan Is Our Serious and Real Adversary

Surely, no warning can be more serious for us than the warning that comes from God Himself—the Creator who is fully aware of our existential structure, who knows the nature and schemes of Satan, and above all, who wills our eternal bliss. The Clarity of Satan’s Attacks

When we hear that Satan’s attacks are recognizable and clear, we may wonder how this can be so, given his non-physical, immaterial nature and his internal insinuations. The answer is that this clarity does not stem from Satan’s essence, but from the kind of invitations and messages he presents—messages that are entirely clear and distinguishable. We actually have a crucial standard for identifying Satan’s intrusions and strikes: our own joy and peace.

In our balanced human state—when the supra-rational dimension governs our being—we are marked by joy and tranquility. In contrast, the typical outcomes of Satan’s invitations and attacks are sorrow, fear, jealousy, rivalry and comparison, laziness, resentment, hypersensitivity, narcissism, despair, exaggeration of problems, sinning, pessimism, disturbing illusions, and similar conditions. These

states not only bear no connection to joy and peace, but actively disrupt our human balance and lead us away from the straight path. It is like a body confronting disease or microbial invasion, showing its imbalance through fever or pain. Likewise, a soul expressing sorrow, fear, or anxiety is revealing its disturbed and unbalanced condition.

Signs and Characteristics of Satan's Attacks

No matter how well we may know the dimensions of our being, if we are unaware of the signs and characteristics of Satan's attacks, we will not succeed in overcoming him. We are up against a skilled adversary—one who knows as many ways to mislead us as there are paths to guide us. If we forget that he lies in wait, we become heedless and sluggish in our movement—giving him the perfect opportunity to strike and carry out his open hostility.

Satan's intrusions carry recognizable signs and are often unmistakably clear. He launches his attacks from every direction—front, back, left, and right—exerting every effort to pull us off the straight path. It makes no difference to him whether he frightens us about the future, unsettles us with the bitterness and failures of the past, tempts us into sin, or immobilizes us through arrogance and pride born of our own virtues. His sole aim is to prevent us from fulfilling the purpose of our creation and growing in resemblance to God—and in this pursuit, he holds nothing back. Whenever our thoughts are not filled with joy and peace, it is a sign that the soundness of our soul has been compromised by Satan's attack. These attacks often carry the scent of jealousy, hatred, hypersensitivity, anxiety, pessimism, sorrow and anger, fear, doubt, and lethargy—each one a tactic of Satan. If we are unable to resist them through opposing action, we risk falling captive to him.
